

Price to Book (trailing 12 months) calculates the ratio of a stock's price to its book value. Price to Cash Flow is the ratio of a stock's price to its cash flow per share. Price to Earnings (next 12 months) calculates the price of a criterion. Investments with 0 points are automatically given an Fi360 stock divided by its earnings per share. ROA is an indicator of how

profitable a company is relative to its total assets. R-Squared is the way in representing their percentile ranking. The lower the Score, the better.
